More than 70 percent of the Earth is covered with water. The oceans, which are the largest bodies of water, are all <u>connected</u> forming one vast body of water.

Three of the oceans surround the frozen South Pole continent of Antarctica are the Pacific Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean and the Indian Ocean. Near the North Pole, the Pacific Ocean and Atlantic Ocean merge into the Arctic Ocean.

The Pacific is the world's largest ocean. It is much larger than all Earth's land put together. It covers more than one third of the Earth's surface and it is twice as large as any other ocean. A large number of Islands <u>rise</u> above the surface of the Pacific Ocean.

The Atlantic is half size of the Pacific and about 3,000 miles wide. It has been very important to history because it <u>separates</u> the American continents from Europe and Africa.

The broad arm of the sea between Africa and Australia is called the Indian Ocean. The Indian Ocean is the world's warmest ocean.

The smallest and coldest ocean, the Arctic <u>surrounds</u> the North Pole. Most of it is frozen all year long.

A sea is a large area of salt water that is smaller than an ocean and it is <u>partially</u> or completely enclosed by land. Usually seas are connected to oceans but sometimes they are inland, where they are closed by land. One salt water lake is Caspian Sea, the largest inland body of water in the world. It is called a sea because it contains salt water, but a lake because it is land locked. Another sea is Black sea, this sea is almost land locked means completely surrounded by land.
