- 3. Comment on the following statements of Jesus:
- (a) "Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's and unto God the things that are God's" (Mark 12:17) (5 marks)
- (b) "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6) (5 marks)
- (c) "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28) (5 marks)
- (d) "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven" (Matthew 6:19-20) (5 marks)
- 4. Explain the significance of Jesus' transfiguration and its implications for Christian faith. Give at least five points. (20 marks)
