## SECTION A COMMUNICATION

1. Read the following passage and answer the questions that follow.

The struggle for survival and the fast growth of the population in developing countries has led to the birth of urban centres. This urbanization tendency is associated with enormous demands for shelter, clothing, water, food, sanitation, education, medicare, transportation, communication, recreation facilities and other services which support life. The migratory tendency of the energetic middle aged people to urban centres is encouraged by the fact that urban centres are thought to have employment opportunities with better remuneration terms.

As evidenced in developed countries, urbanization is an important dimension of economic and social progress. Urbanization is characterized by high life expectancy, high literacy rates, more school enrolment, high usage of mass media, improved medicare, high calorific and protein consumption and high income per capita.

With population influx, congestion has become a major problem and this in turn has contributed to the establishment of unplanned and disorganized urban centres as facilities to cope with the inflow are almost non-existent. These disorganized urban centres lack technical skills in building and managing the centres. This has led to constructing structures of low standards using inappropriate building materials. Power and water supplies are intermittent and no efforts are made to conserve them.

There are neither methods of treating nor disposing off the waste. The centres are stinking. Where transport and communication exist, they work below expectations. All innovative efforts are frustrated by lack of capital which would have enhanced better urbanization processes.
