    - (ii) What business did the way threaten that made the Ephesians react so badly against the Way?

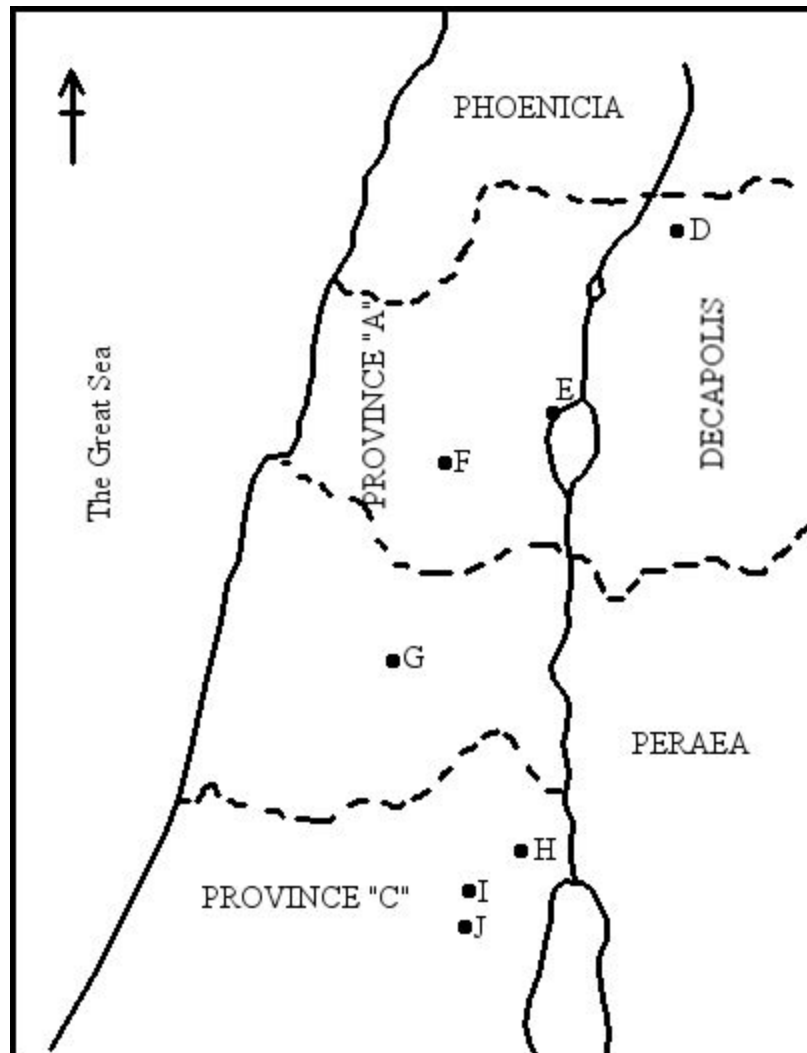

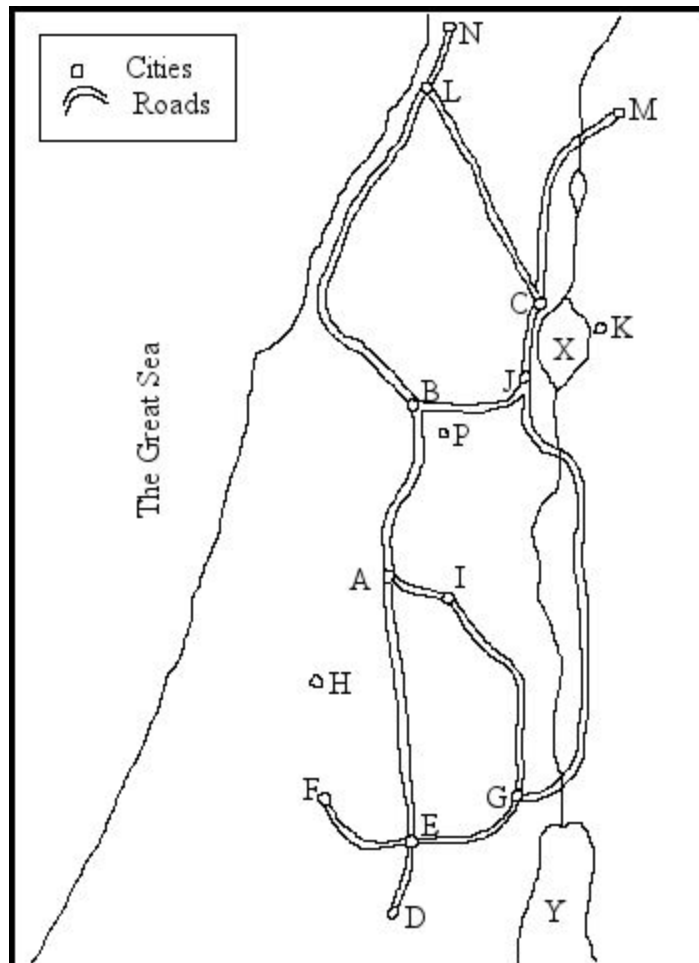
