Correct answer: D. human dignity.

Reason: Bearing false witness damages the reputation and respect of a person, hence when one avoids it, the dignity and honor of a neighbor are preserved.

- ii) "Your name is Jacob, no longer shall your name be called Jacob but Israel shall be your name" (Genesis 32:28). Why was Jacob's name changed to Israel?
- A. He had striven with God and his enemies and still prevailed.
- B. He had striven with God and the Israelites and still prevailed.
- C. He had striven with God and men and still prevailed.
- D. He had striven with God and his brother and still prevailed.
- E. He had striven with God and his sons and still prevailed.

Correct answer: C. He had striven with God and men and still prevailed.

Reason: The name Israel was given to Jacob after wrestling with God and prevailing, symbolizing his struggles with both divine and human beings and his ultimate victory.

Correct answer: B. Covenant people.

Reason: In the Bible, those who make an agreement with God are referred to as covenant people because they live under God's covenant promises and obligations.

Reason: The ultimate consequence of their disobedience was death, in addition to suffering and labor.

Correct answer: B. God is above our authority.

Reason: The plagues showed that God's power is supreme over Pharaoh's authority and all human rulers.

Reason: Cutting down trees and polluting the environment are major causes of environmental destruction

today.

Reason: These five are recognized as the major judges in Israel's history.

God give human beings to exercise?

Correct answer: A. Their willpower.

Reason: By giving instructions, God allows human beings to exercise free will in choosing to obey Him or

not.

xviii) Among important persons during the New Testament time were the Scribes. What was their main function?

- B. To keep the synagogues or Sanhedrin in good order.
- C. To preach the word of God to the gentiles.

Reason: The scribes were mainly responsible for writing, interpreting the law, and copying manuscripts.

Correct answer: D. Samaritans.

Reason: The Jews and Samaritans had a long-standing conflict and were not in good terms with each other.

- xx) As a member of the society, what behaviour of people these days resembles that of the people of Babel in Genesis 11:1–9?
- A. Pride and building themselves tall apartment for show off.
- B. Pride and living the whole family in the same place as a symbol of unity.
- C. Pride and putting more emphasis on technological advancement for greatness.
- D. Pride and speaking the same language as an identity.
- E. Pride and show off of their wealth pretending to be gods on earth.

Correct answer: C. Pride and putting more emphasis on technological advancement for greatness.

Reason: The people of Babel built a tower to glorify themselves; today, people's pride is shown through dependence on technology for power and greatness.

2. Match the description of missionary activity in List A with the names of the respective places in List B by writing the letter of the correct response beside the corresponding item number in the answer booklet(s) provided.

i) The missionaries began to preach the Gospel first to the Jews. - **F. Salamis**

Reason: In Salamis, Paul and Barnabas first preached the gospel to the Jews in their synagogues.

ii) The missionaries confronted an opponent of the Gospel. – **D. Paphos**

Reason: At Paphos, Paul confronted Elymas the sorcerer who opposed the message.

iii) The missionaries made many disciples in the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit. – **E. Perga** Reason: In Perga, they made many disciples as the Spirit guided them during their mission.

iv) The missionaries faced great opposition and discouragement. – **B. Iconium**

Reason: At Iconium, they faced strong opposition from Jews and Gentiles, leading to discouragement.

v) The missionaries preached the word of God on their way back to Antioch of Syria. – **A. Derbe** Reason: On their way back from Derbe, they strengthened believers and continued spreading the word

before returning to Antioch.

3. "The conquest of Jericho began with the revelation of God to Joshua. Joshua saw a commander of the Lord's army holding a sword, meaning the conquest would be God's undertaking and not man's military force (Joshua 5:13-6:27)."

a) One of the instructions given to Joshua was to march around Jericho once daily for six days and seven times on the seventh day with the priests blowing trumpets. This taught obedience and reliance on God.

b) The items spared were silver, gold, bronze and iron vessels which were dedicated to the Lord, while everything else was destroyed.

c) The lesson is that victory comes only through obedience to God's instructions, not human strength.

4. "Let another take his position of overseer" (Acts 1:20).

a) The person was Judas Iscariot. He betrayed Jesus, leading to his death, and his place was to be taken by another.

b) He was replaced through casting lots among the disciples, and Matthias was chosen to take his place.

c) In the church today, when a leader's position becomes vacant, proper procedure such as prayer, selection and confirmation should be followed to ensure continuity of leadership.

5. "According to Matthew 21:18-22 Jesus cursed the fig tree."

- a) Cursing the fig tree meant judgment on hypocrisy, since the tree looked fruitful but had no figs, symbolizing empty religion.
- b) Jesus taught that faith without works is useless and that believers should be fruitful in their spiritual lives.
- c) The Church today learns that Christians must be fruitful in their service to God and not just appear religious outwardly.

6. In the Gospel according to Luke, women are regarded as the first witnesses of Jesus" resurrection (Luke 23 and 24).

- a) One incident was Mary Magdalene and other women finding the empty tomb and meeting angels who told them that Jesus had risen.
- b) God wanted to show that women also had an important role in spreading the gospel and were not to be looked down upon.
- c) Society today should treat women as equals, giving them dignity and opportunities in leadership and ministry.

7. "Luke 13:20-21 is about Jesus' parable of the leaven or yeast."

- a) The parable teaches that the kingdom of God is like yeast that a woman mixed into flour until it worked through all the dough.
- b) The yeast represents the influence of the kingdom of God that starts small but spreads to transform the whole world.
- c) The church today learns that small acts of faith can have great impact in spreading God's kingdom.

8. In Luke 4:1-12 we read about the temptations of Jesus and the responses he gave to Satan which made him overcome all of Satan's temptations.

- a) In the third temptation, Jesus refused to throw himself down from the temple by quoting Scripture, showing that we should not put God to the test. This teaches Christians today to trust God without seeking signs.
- b) In the second temptation, Jesus rejected Satan's offer of all kingdoms in exchange for worship, teaching Christians to worship only God and not seek worldly power.

c) In the first temptation, Jesus rejected turning stones into bread, showing that life depends on God's

word, not just physical needs. This teaches believers to put spiritual needs above material ones.

9. "In Matthew 16:24-28, Jesus talked about the cost of being a disciple, asking His disciples what

they would benefit if they got everything on earth and lose their soul forever."

a) The cost that Jesus mentioned was self-denial. This means a disciple must be ready to give up personal

desires and ambitions.

Another cost was carrying one's cross. This symbolizes enduring suffering, persecution, and hardship for

the sake of following Christ.

Jesus also mentioned following Him. This requires full obedience and commitment to His teachings and

lifestyle.

b) The cost that seemed to bring conflict at that time was self-denial. People found it difficult to sacrifice

their personal interests for the sake of others.

The call to carry the cross also brought conflict. Many Jews expected a Messiah who would bring

prosperity and political power, not suffering and sacrifice.

c) Today, some disciples truly pay these costs. They dedicate their time and resources to preaching the

gospel and helping the needy.

Others endure persecution, imprisonment, or even death in countries where Christianity is opposed.

However, many preachers today do not fully embrace these costs. Some prioritize wealth and fame over

sacrifice and service, showing that the cost is not being paid by all.

10. "The Pharisees added many rules to the Law of Moses. However, they insisted more on three

laws about how people should behave in their community."

a) The Pharisees were a Jewish religious group during Jesus' time. They were strict teachers of the Law of

Moses.

They believed that by adding extra rules, they would help people obey the law more carefully and avoid

sin.

They were respected by many people but also criticized by Jesus for hypocrisy and focusing too much on

outward behavior.

b) One of the laws they emphasized was the Sabbath law. They insisted that no work should be done on the

Sabbath day.

They also emphasized laws of ritual purity. People had to follow strict washing rules before eating and

worshipping.

Another law they insisted on was tithing. People were required to give a tenth of their earnings and

produce.

c) One belief of the Pharisees similar to that of the Church today is prayer. The Pharisees valued regular

prayer in public and private life.

Another similarity is worship. The Pharisees stressed worship in the synagogue, just as the Church

emphasizes worship in church services.

11. Refer to Acts 4:34-35 and show how communal life has become inapplicable in our society today.

In the early church, people shared everything they had, and no one was in need.

Today, communal life is inapplicable because people are more individualistic and prefer to own their

property privately.

Greed and corruption prevent the fair distribution of resources. Some people misuse what is shared for

personal benefit.

The high cost of living makes people focus more on survival and personal gain rather than sharing.

Modern society is built on capitalism, which encourages competition and wealth accumulation instead of communal sharing.

12. Assess the participation of the church in protecting the lives of the underprivileged people, as Moses intervened to protect the life of the Hebrew slaves.

The church protects the underprivileged by providing basic needs such as food, clothing, and shelter.

Churches also offer education to poor children who cannot afford school fees.

The church advocates for justice and human rights, speaking against oppression and exploitation.

Churches provide counseling and legal aid to those who cannot defend themselves.

In times of disasters, churches mobilize resources to rescue and support victims.

Through health services, churches protect the lives of the poor by running hospitals and clinics.

13. Describe four teachings which Christians today can learn from the two creation stories presented in the book of Genesis Chapters 1-2.

Christians learn that God is the Creator of everything. This teaches respect for nature and all created beings.

They learn the importance of rest. God rested on the seventh day, showing the value of the Sabbath.

They learn that human beings are made in the image of God. This gives all people dignity and responsibility.

They learn that God created man and woman to live in harmony. This shows the importance of family and unity.
