- (i) Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a son and his name shall be called Emmanuel (Mt. 1:23).
- (ii) For all who take the sword will perish by the sword (Mt. 26:52).
- (iii) This is my beloved son with whom I am well pleased (Mt. 3:17).

- 3. Jesus was led by the spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil (Mt. 4:1-11).
- (a) State the temptations and the corresponding answers of Jesus. Explain.
- (i) Turn stones into bread: Jesus answered, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God," teaching reliance on God's provision over physical needs.
- (ii) Jump from the pinnacle of the temple: Jesus replied, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test," emphasizing trust in God without testing Him.
- (iii) Worship Satan to gain worldly power: Jesus said, "You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve," highlighting loyalty to God above all.
- (b) What good example can Christians learn from the temptation of Jesus? Christians learn to resist temptation by relying on God's word, trusting in His plans, and prioritizing spiritual over worldly desires.

Paul and Silas encountered a slave girl possessed by a spirit of divination who followed them, proclaiming that they were servants of God. Paul, distressed by her constant shouting, commanded the spirit to leave her in Jesus' name. The spirit left, leading to the loss of income for her owners, who then accused Paul and Silas, resulting in their imprisonment.

- 8. (a) Identify five ways in which the Holy Spirit manifested itself on the day of Pentecost.
- (i) A sound like a rushing wind filled the room.
- (ii) Tongues of fire appeared and rested on each person.
- (iii) The apostles began speaking in different languages.
- (iv) Peter preached boldly to the crowd.
- (v) Three thousand people were baptized and added to the church.
- (b) What did Peter teach about Jesus on the day of Pentecost?

Peter taught that Jesus was the Messiah who was crucified and raised from the dead by God. He called the people to repent and be baptized in His name for the forgiveness of sins.

- (c) Explain how the works of the Holy Spirit are witnessed by Christians in the church of Tanzania today. In Tanzania, the Holy Spirit is witnessed through the growth of churches, unity among Christians, miraculous healings, empowerment of leaders, and transformation of lives through evangelism and charity work.
- 9. Name the person who said the following words and mention the occasion in which they were used.
- (a) My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my savior (Lk. 1:46).

Person: Mary

Occasion: Mary said these words in her song of praise, known as the Magnificat, when she visited Elizabeth after learning that she would give birth to Jesus.

(b) Blessed be the Lord God of Israel for he has visited and redeemed his people (Lk. 1:68).

Person: Zechariah

Occasion: Zechariah said these words in his prophecy, known as the Benedictus, after the birth of his son John the Baptist when his speech was restored.

(c) For mine eyes have seen thy salvation which thou hast prepared in the presence of all peoples (Lk. 2:30-31).

Person: Simeon

Occasion: Simeon said these words when he held baby Jesus in the temple, recognizing Him as the Messiah during His dedication.

(d) You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? (Lk. 3:7).

Person: John the Baptist

Occasion: John the Baptist said these words to the Pharisees and Sadducees who came to him for baptism, rebuking their hypocrisy and lack of repentance.

(e) Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me (Lk. 18:38).

Person: A blind beggar

Occasion: The blind beggar cried out to Jesus as He was passing by Jericho, seeking healing for his blindness.

(f) And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved (Acts 4:12).

Person: Peter

Occasion: Peter said these words when defending his faith before the Sanhedrin after healing a lame man in the name of Jesus.

(g) We have heard him speak blasphemous words against Moses and God (Acts 6:11).

Person: False witnesses

Occasion: These words were spoken by false witnesses during the trial of Stephen, accusing him of blasphemy before the Sanhedrin.

(h) Give me also this power, that any one on whom I lay my hands may receive the Holy Spirit (Acts 8:19). Person: Simon the magician

Occasion: Simon the magician said these words to Peter and John after witnessing the apostles imparting the Holy Spirit through the laying on of hands.

(i) Is not this the man who made havoc in Jerusalem of those who called on this name? (Acts 9:21).

Person: Jews in Damascus

Occasion: These words were spoken by Jews in Damascus, expressing their astonishment at Paul's conversion and preaching of Christ.

- 11. "But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your living with harlots, you killed for him the fatted calf" (Lk. 15:30).
- (a) Who said those words, when was it, and what drove him/her to say such nasty words?

These words were said by the elder brother in the parable of the Prodigal Son. He said this to his father when he saw the celebration held for his younger brother upon his return. The elder brother felt anger and

resentment because he believed his loyalty and hard work had been overlooked while his brother, who squandered his inheritance, was being honored.

(b) From the above statement, we are told that the son involved himself with harlots. In your opinion, what are the consequences of living such a life?

The consequences of living such a life may include loss of personal dignity, financial ruin, damaged relationships, spiritual emptiness, and long-term regret over poor choices. It leads to moral decay and estrangement from God and family.

12. Explain the parable of the Good Samaritan and the lessons Christians can learn from it (Lk. 10:29-37).

The parable of the Good Samaritan tells of a man who was attacked by robbers and left for dead. A priest and a Levite passed by without helping, but a Samaritan, despite the enmity between Jews and Samaritans, stopped to care for the man. He bandaged his wounds, took him to an inn, and paid for his care.

Lessons Christians can learn:

- Love for all people regardless of race or background.
- Compassion and selflessness in helping those in need.
- Actions are more important than religious titles or positions.
- Being a true neighbor means showing mercy and kindness to everyone.
- 13. "And behold you will be silent and unable to speak until the day that these things will come to pass because you have not believed in my words" (Lk. 1:20).

Explain the story behind those words mentioning the characters and the incident of that conversation. These words were spoken by the angel Gabriel to Zechariah in the temple. Zechariah doubted the angel's message that his wife Elizabeth would bear a son, John the Baptist, despite their old age. As a sign of God's power and as a rebuke for his unbelief, Zechariah was rendered mute until the prophecy was fulfilled.

This angered her owners, who lost their income from her fortune-telling abilities. They brought false accusations against Paul and Silas, leading to their imprisonment.

The works of the Holy Spirit in Tanzania are seen through the growth of churches, active evangelism, miraculous healings, and the transformation of lives. The Spirit inspires unity among Christians, strengthens leaders in their mission, and empowers believers to preach the Gospel and live righteous lives.
