(iv) Environmental rights Are any proclamation of a human right to environmental conditions of a specified quality or environmental rights are an extension of the basic human rights mankind requires and deserves.

Importance:

They help people to conserve environment

They protect natural resources like forest, animals, etc.

They help people to get safe and clean water and food.

(v) Citizenship Is a state of a person to belong to a part liar country like Tanzania.

Importance

A citizen receives legal rights for belonging to a certain country and is protected as the citizen of that country.

It is the legal way of being recognized as a person belonging to particular country.

The country receives loyalty from its citizens.

(vi) Economic activities are the activities of making, providing, purchasing or selling goods and services.

Importance

They make people improve their living standards through employment.

They facilitate production and distribution of goods and services.

They make the country gets foreign exchange through exportation of raw materials and goods.

(vii) By election is a kind of election which is held to fill in vacant position after general election such as Ward Councilors and Members of Parliament.

Importance

(viii) Civics Is the study of rights and responsibilities of citizens in a state or country.

Importance

To understand the duties and responsibilities of citizens such as work, ,section of the environment, respect for each other, etc.

(ix) Free Mass Media are free sources of information and news such as radios, TVs, newspapers and magazines that reach and influence large number of people.

Importance

Educate people about economic, political, social and cultural issues.

They make people be aware of what is going on around the world such as disasters like earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, terrorism, etc.

They help students to acquire knowledge through watching TVs, reading newspapers and magazines.

(x) Zebra Crossing are symbols drawn on the roads whereby vehicles stop to allow pedestrians to cross the road.

Importance

They help to prevent accidents as they give instructions to the road users like pedestrians and drivers.

They reduce the burden of using many traffic police to control vehicles.

They help to regulate the speed of the drivers especially in the settlements.
