- (i) Majengo was watching a football match between Kagera Sugar and Mbeya City at the BWM stadium. In this situation, Majengo was a:
- A) striker
- B) defender
- C) goalkeeper
- D) spectator

Correct Answer: D) spectator

Reason: A spectator is someone who watches a match or event. The other options, such as striker, defender, and goalkeeper, are players involved in the match, not individuals watching it.

- (ii) Imagine you are filling in an official form. You come across an item that requires you to fill in the particulars about the country you belong to. What does this item refer to?
- A) nationality
- B) marital status
- C) national
- D) nationalization

Correct Answer: A) nationality

Reason: Nationality refers to the country a person is from. Marital status, national, and nationalization are not related to identifying the country of origin.

- (iii) Neema was at point A in the east when she saw the ball at point B in the west. At the same time, Baraka at point C saw the same ball in the south. In which direction would Neema see Baraka?
- A) South-East
- B) North-West
- C) North-East
- D) South-West

Correct Answer: C) North-East

Reason: From Neema's position in the east, Baraka is in the south. To locate Baraka from the east, one would look towards the north-east.

- (iv) When you want to buy a pair of shoes and you have less money, you will ask the shopkeeper to give you a discount. If you manage to get a discount, what does that act refer to?
- A) Arguing
- B) Bargaining
- C) Asking
- D) Requesting

Correct Answer: B) Bargaining

Reason: Bargaining is the process of negotiating prices. Arguing and asking refer to different types of interactions, while requesting is a more general term, not specific to price negotiation.

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- (v) Anna told her mother, "I like reading story books." It happens that her mother likes the same activity. How would Anna's mother reply to Anna?
- A) So do me
- B) And me too I like
- C) So do I
- D) And me also

Correct Answer: C) So do I

Reason: "So do I" is the correct response when someone shares the same liking or action. The other options are grammatically incorrect or awkward.

- (vi) If you are asked to rewrite the sentence "Women are inferior" into its opposite. How would your sentence read?
- A) Women are good
- B) Women are of low status
- C) Women are superior
- D) Women are equal

Correct Answer: C) Women are superior

Reason: The opposite of "inferior" is "superior." The other options do not directly oppose the term "inferior" in a meaningful way.

- (vii) When a person says, he has enough money to buy a new car, what does it mean?
- A) He will buy a car.
- B) He does not buy a new car.
- C) He is able to buy a new car.
- D) He cannot buy a new car.

Correct Answer: C) He is able to buy a new car.

Reason: If a person has enough money, it means they are financially able to make the purchase. The other options are either assumptions or contradictions of this meaning.

- (viii) Our English teacher asked four students to use the action "hear" to compose a sentence that shows an ongoing activity. There was only one student who composed a correct sentence. Identify the correct sentence among the following:
- A) I hear noises from outside.
- B) He is hearing what you say.
- C) We are hearing them singing.
- D) Speak up! I am not hearing you.

Correct Answer: B) He is hearing what you say.

Reason: "He is hearing" shows an ongoing activity using the verb "hear" in its continuous form. The other options either use incorrect tense or awkward phrasing.

- (ix) You have learnt the uses of articles 'a' and 'an'. Using the acquired knowledge, why is it correct to say "an hour" but saying "an university" is incorrect?
- A) 'a' is used before a consonant sound while 'an' is used before a vowel sound.
- B) 'an' and 'a' are used interchangeably without considering the sounds.
- C) 'a' is used with long words while 'an' is used with short words.
- D) 'an' and 'a' can be used with all nouns that begin with vowel letters.

Correct Answer: A) 'a' is used before a consonant sound while 'an' is used before a vowel sound.

Reason: The choice of 'a' or 'an' depends on the sound that follows. "Hour" starts with a vowel sound, so "an" is used, while "university" starts with a "y" sound, which is a consonant, so "a" is correct.

- (x) Which factual information accounts for Taifa Stars' failure to earn points in the league of champions?
- A) It could be due to lack of patriotism from the players.
- B) Probably the team does not have experienced players.
- C) It is because of the budget that didn't cater for the needs in the preparation process.
- D) It is likely because of short time preparations.

Correct Answer: D) It is likely because of short time preparations.

Reason: Short time preparations can negatively impact a team's performance. While budget or experience may also contribute, the short preparation time is a likely cause of failure in a league setting.

Passive: Crop destructive mice are killed by the farmer.

4. For each of the items (i) - (v), choose one word from the box that best describes the message communicated in each of the following situations

Words: arrangement, promise, habit, certainty, possibility

(i) Monica tells her friends: "When I grow up, I will be inviting my friends for dinner every weekend."

Answer: Promise

Reason: Monica is expressing her intention to invite her friends regularly in the future, indicating a commitment.

(ii) Neema is aware that her sick friend, Madina, is admitted to the regional hospital. She is heard saying, "I will visit Madina tomorrow."

Answer: Promise

Reason: Neema is committing to visit her friend, indicating a future action she intends to carry out.

(iii) My father doubted our ability to pass the examination. In response, I told him: "I assure you that I will pass our examinations because I had been working very hard."

Answer: Certainty

Reason: The speaker is expressing confidence in passing the examination due to prior hard work.

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(iv) My daughter has been repeatedly reminding me to buy her a gift. Today I had to tell her, "My daughter, today I will buy you a doll."

Answer: Promise

Reason: The speaker is committing to buy a gift for their daughter today.

(v) Ashura has a negative attitude towards life. However, Halima has some hope. She was heard saying, "Ashura will presumably change her attitude towards life."

Answer: Possibility

Reason: Halima is suggesting that there is a chance Ashura might change her attitude, indicating uncertainty.

5. Your friend is looking for some information in the dictionary. She sees and lists the abbreviations she does not understand. Provide the long forms of the following abbreviations so that she understands what they stand for:

(i) sb

Answer: somebody

Reason: "Sb" is commonly used as an abbreviation for "somebody" in informal contexts.

(ii) sth

Answer: something

Reason: "Sth" is used as an abbreviation for "something" in informal contexts.

(iii) adj

Answer: adjective

Reason: "Adj" is the standard abbreviation for "adjective" in grammatical contexts.

(iv) n

Answer: noun

Reason: "N" is commonly used as an abbreviation for "noun" in grammatical contexts.

(v) AmE

Answer: American English

Reason: "AmE" stands for "American English," referring to the variety of English spoken in the United

States.

(vi) v

Answer: verb

Reason: "V" is commonly used as an abbreviation for "verb" in grammatical contexts.

(vii) adv

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Answer: adverb

Reason: "Adv" is the standard abbreviation for "adverb" in grammatical contexts.
