Mr. Miraji is the head teacher of Mtoni Primary School. Yesterday he invited Mr. Jaku to come to his school to talk to the pupils about the effects of drug abuse. Mr. Jaku is a doctor. Also Mr. Jaku said many people who use cocaine and heroin their bodies become very weak compared to non users. This is because they dislike eating food due to losing appetite. Therefore, they just like eating snacks and juice.

Apart from that Mr. Jaku told the pupils, for the people who drink alcohol usually destroy their respect because they act bad behavior to the people around them regardless if they are relatives or friends. It is believed that they become unconscious at that moment.

The pupils were sitting in the hall and they were very quiet listening to Mr. Jaku attentively. Many people have been divorced with their spouses, others they have been taken to jail and also mental hospital. The main victims of this problem are youths.
