- 1. Choose the correct answer and write its letter in the box provided:
 - (i) Which of the following action contributes to pollution of water sources?
 - A. Modern animal husbandry
 - B. Fetching water from the river

Answer: C. Taking a bath in a river

Reason: Bathing in rivers introduces dirt and soap into the water, causing pollution.
